Everyone managed to escape with only the clothes they were wearing. Everything else was lost in the boat as it was swallowed up in the sea. You could be stuck on the island forever.

- · Create TEN laws for the island.
- 2. Discuss and outline how you will survive on the island.
- · How will work be distributed?
- · Who will work?
- · Will there be anyone who doesn't work? Why?
- · How would you provide food to your society? How would you divide-up your resources?
- 3. Create a name and motto for your island that suits its benefits and structure.
- 4. On chart paper, draw your island's name and motto. Be prepared to share with your classmates how decisions will be made and how your island will survive.
